Notes from the District Superintendent



On the day of Pentecost the disciples were gathered in a large upper room when the Holy Spirit descends upon

them. Luke writes, "Suddenly a sound from heaven like the howling of a fierce wind filled the entire house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be individual flames of fire alighting on each one of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them to speak." (Acts 2:2-4 CEB)

I can only imagine that the disciples were surprised by the Holy Spirit's arrival. Though Jesus instructed the disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they had received the promise of the Father (Luke 24:49), they don't have a clue what to expect; neither do we.

The disciples' experience of the Holy Spirit is quite different from our own. They experienced the Holy Spirit as a surprising, wild, untamable, unpredictable presence. They were overwhelmed by the Spirit which thrust them into situations well beyond their comfort

zones. There is nothing meek or mild about the Spirit. Instead, they experienced the Spirit as the surprising, unpredictable, all-powerful life of Jesus in them.

Consider the following. Does the modern North American church's experience remotely resemble the New Testament church's experience of the Spirit? When we gather for worship, do we come expecting to experience the power of the Holy Spirit or do we assume we'll have the same predictable, comfortable, if not boring service like the week before? What would we do if God showed up on Sunday? Would we be transformed by the experience, would we go back to life as usual, or would we dismiss it as "something we don't do."

The disciples were instructed by Jesus to wait patiently and prayerfully for the revealing of the Holy Spirit. What if we were to do the same? Come Holy Spirit Come!

Conference Apportionments—Where is the SED?

As of the first four months (33%) of the year, the SED is a little behind our target pace having only paid 30% of its Conference Apportionments.

District Conference Summary

A called District Conference was held Wednesday, April 30, at Woodcrest UMC in Lumberton. Morris Albright, Chair of the District Trustees, reported on the sale of the Impact Parsonage, the Jefferson Street Property, and Texas Methodist Foundation Loan on the Jefferson Street Property. Afterwards the conference authorized district Trustees to take all necessary actions to sell the district-owned church campus (Impact New Church Start) for a maximum negotiated price.
